

### China's coal output edges up in August as mines reopen

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

China's August coal output edged up from a 26-month low in the prior month, as Beijing re-opened dozens of mines and approved several new ones to ensure supply and cool high prices.

The world's largest miner and consumer of coal churned out 335.24 million tonnes of the commodity last month, data from the National Bureau of Statistics showed on Wednesday. That compares to 314.17 million tonnes in July and up 0.8% from a year earlier.

Coal production over the first eight months of 2021 was 2.6 billion tonnes, up 4.4% on year. However, to ensure sufficient supply and meet strong demand at power plants during the winter heating season, Beijing has re-opened 67 million tonnes of open-pit mines in the Inner Mongolia region

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

According to the RF Federal Customs Service, in January-July 2021 Russia exported 116.4 mn tons of coal, up 10.9% year-on-year. In terms of value, coal export amounted to over \$7.9 bn, up 15.8% year-on-year.

Coal import during the period under report made 12.2 mn tons, down 0.8% year-on-year, worth \$226.9 mn, up 30.9% year-on-year.

Coke and coal char export in January-July 2021 made 1.9 mn tons, up 42.1% year-on-year, worth \$485.6 mn (up 2.1-fold year-on-year).

In July, coal export made 14.5 mn tons, down 3.2% year-on-year and down 29.1% month-on-month. Value-wise, coal export increased by 14.9% year-on-year and declined by 27.7% month-on-month making 1.1 bn.

Coke and coal char export in July amounted to 200.1 thousand tons, down 27.7% year-on-year and down 28.9% month-on-month. In terms of value it was worth \$62.7 mn, up 32.6% year-on-year and down 24.8% month-on-month.

## Asia's coal prices hit new highs as global utilities scramble for fuel

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

Coal prices from exporters Australia and Indonesia have also scaled all-time highs recently, with Australia's Newcastle prices rising roughly 50% and Indonesian export prices up 30% in the last three months.

The most-traded thermal coal futures contract on the Zhengzhou Commodity Exchange jumped more than 4% on Tuesday to a record high of 979 yuan (\$151.63) a tonne. In India, prices of better burning U.S. thermal coal (6900 NAR) in North Indian retail markets have risen by a third in the last 15 days and are up by more than 100% from a year ago to 14,600 Indian rupees a tonne.

Coal supply is struggling to catch up with demand in top consumer China as mine safety checks slow output.

In number two consumer India, the monsoon season and COVID-19 restrictions have hampered production.

**GLOBAL STRENGTH** 

Chinese futures for coking coal, a raw material mainly used in steelmaking, are also surging, and have gained over 50% in the past three months.

### Germany uses coal in first place as energy

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

Destatis added that 56 percent of all the energy produced in Germany during that six-month period (258.9 billion kilowatt hours) came from conventional sources such as coal, natural gas or nuclear energy.

According to the Wiesbaden-based statistical agency, this figure is 20.9 percent more than in the same period last year.

Meanwhile, the share of energy generated by renewable sources such as wind, solar or biogas fell by 11.7 percent compared to the same period in 2020, to 44 percent.

According to official statistics, the lack of wind during the spring in Germany caused the share of wind power to plummet 21 percent compared to the same period last year.

This led to the share of wind power in the total amount fed into the German power grid to fall from 29.1 percent to 22.1 percent.

Behind coal and wind power, natural gas was the third most important energy source for electricity production in Germany in the first half of this year, with a share of 14.4 percent, ahead of nuclear power (12.4 percent).

According to the current legal situation, Germany should completely abandon coal-fired power production by 2038 at the latest

## China Aug coal imports rise 36% on tight domestic supply

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

China's coal imports in August rose 35.8% from a year ago as buyers rushed to source the dirty fuel from overseas due to tight domestic supply and strong demand. China, the world's biggest coal consumer, brought in 28.05 million tonnes of coal last month, down from 30.18 million tonnes in July but well above 20.66 million tonnes in August last year, data from the General Administration of Customs showed on Tuesday. Over the first eight months, China imported a total of 197.69 million tonnes of coal, down 10.3% year-on-year.
